It was indicated that with a substantially expanded store Tesco would be able to introduce new lines and Ms. Hardman indicated that traders in Peel needed to find niche markets.

In conclusion it was *AGREED* that the previous decision not to comment on the application be confirmed.

Ms. Hardman referred to the new bus service to the Ballawattleworth Estate and indicated that some concern had been expressed over the speed of large vehicles now that the speed humps had been reduced in size. Mr. Lace indicated that at the recent Western Traffic Management meeting the Department of Transport had undertaken to monitor the speed of vehicles at this estate.

The Minister had concurred with the Inspector's conclusions and accepted his recommendation that the Appeal should be allowed and accordingly directed that the decision of the Planning Authority be reversed and permission be granted. *NOTED* 

ANNE FRANK EXHIBITION 09/021

Members noted receipt of a letter from the project co-ordinator with regard to the Anne Frank Exhibition that would take place in March 2010 at St. Germans Cathedral. Ms. Hardman indicated that she was happy to be nominated to represent the Commissioners on a steering committee which had recently been formed to promote this exhibition.

HARBOURSIDE DEVELOPMENT 09/022

Mrs. Birkett referred to contact she had had from Mr. Stephen Moore expressing concern at the possible sale of land at the Weatherglass Corner by the Department of Transport. Concern was aimed at the possible demolition of old buildings including the Sailors Shelter and the Harbour Masters Office. Members felt that the old buildings within the Town should be retained. It was *AGREED* to check on the current status of the Harbour Masters Office in terms of planning status and that a letter should be sent to the Department of Local Government and the Environment requesting that a preservation order be placed on the property.

SWINE FLU

09/023

Mr. Skidmore referred to the recent concerns over the pandemic swine flu. The Town Clerk indicated that no plan was in place with the Commissioners as his previous request to attend a Health Service seminar on pandemic flu had been refused by the Commissioners. Mr. Jones proposed that should any future meetings/seminars be held by Government then the Town Clerk should attend. *AGREED* 

ROAD TRAFFIC 09/024 REGULATION ACT 1985 Draft Orders relating to Peel Day prepared by the Department of Transport were noted and found acceptable.

A further Order under the Act revoking a reserved parking place on a section of Circular Road was noted.

ENFORCEMENT ISSUES 09/025 AND PLANNING WORKSHOP The Town Clerk referred to a letter from the Secretary to the Planning Committee which indicated that in future local authorities would no longer be copied into correspondence concerning alleged offences when a planning breach was under investigation. Local Authorities would only be written to under separate cover if they were the complainants initiating any such action. Members objected to the decision of the Planning Committee and it was *AGREED* that an appropriate letter be sent to the Secretary of the Planning Committee with a copy to Mr. Crookall, MHK.

It was further noted that the Department intended to hold a planning workshop aimed specifically at local authorities and a request had been made for feedback as to suggested topics for discussion. It was suggested that being copied into breaches of planning matter under investigation should be considered together with conservation related matters.

MANX ELECTRICITY 09/026 AUTHORITY Consideration was given to a request from the Manx Electricity Authority to establish an electric vehicle charging facility alongside the sub-station on Strand Street. The proposal would involve the loss of two parking spaces to enable this temporary service to operate.

Members expressed concern at the possible loss of parking spaces within the Town and on that basis were not prepared to sanction the use of the Strand Street car parking area. It was *AGREED* to advise the Manx Electricity Authority to consider alternative locations.

HOUSING (FLATS) 09/027 REGULATIONS ACT 1982

The Town Clerk referred to a recommendation from the Environmental Health Technician that Flats 7, 8, 9, and 10 Wood View Court, Reayrt ny Keylley, Peel be registered under the Housing (Flats) Regulations 1982. *AGREED* 

GIRLS GUIDE 09/028 CENTENARY Consideration was given to a request from Girl Guiding UK which was celebrating 100 years of guiding during 2009 and 2010. Part of the celebrations would be beach barbeque on Peel Beach on 6<sup>th</sup> September 2009 between 3pm and

5pm. Members had no objection to the request
for use of part of the beach and it was AGREED
that the organisers may wish to use a local
caterer for the event.

ONCHAN SERVICE	CIVIC

09/029 The Town Clerk indicated that Onchan Civic Service would take place on 24<sup>th</sup> May 2009 at 2.35pm. It was *AGREED* that the Chairman would attend.

PROMENADE KIOSK 09/030

Consideration was given to a letter from Mrs. Marianne Brew, tenant of the Promenade Kiosk seeking permission to erect a tent alongside the kiosk during the TT fortnight, Carnival Day, Beach Mission period and the Manx Grand Prix fortnight. *AGREED* 

BMX TRACK 09/031

The Chairman indicated that work was shortly due to start on the upgrading of the BMX track. The area would be barriered off and top soil supplied by Heritage Homes Limited would be utilised to improve the track. The Chairman indicated that he was hopeful that the facility would be up and running by the summer. *NOTED* 

SCHOOL VISIT 09/032

It was noted that Mr. Lace and Mr. Jones would arrange to visit the Clothworkers School shortly to discuss matters of mutual interest. Arising therefrom reference was made to the suggestions made be Year Six pupils at the QEII for the town regeneration. It was suggested that these views be placed on the website.

NEW MEDICAL CENTRE 09/033 The Chairman expressed his disappointment that the proposed new medical centre was not anticipated to be completed until 2011. It was *AGREED* that a letter be sent to the Department of Health and Social Security enquiring as to

whey it should take so long.
